From the desk of the CEO

Dear Holland Christian Homes Community,

During this past month, HCH like the rest of Ontario experienced an unusual dumping of snow. Due to the significant amount of snow that fell over an extended period, it was challenging to clean around the property especially between cars. I want to personally thank you for your patience as we worked to clear the property of this snow. I especially want to thank those of you who took the



time to help others during this time, and to our dedicated staff who came to work despite the bad weather to assist in the clean-up and to ensure our residents and tenants received essential care and services.

We have bins of salt at each entrance as well as a shovel to help clean between cars. We ask that you please return the shovel when finished with it. For your information, the exterior sidewalks along McLaughlin Road and Kingknoll Drive are on city property, and therefore the responsibility of the City to clear after a snowfall.

It is time for the "Annual Tenant Survey". The survey will be delivered to each tenant's internal mailbox within the next month. In consultation with the Tenant Advisory Committee, the survey will be limited to just a few questions which are more open-ended with the intent to solicit more effective feedback. There will be a drop-off box at reception and a secondary drop-off box on the Kingknoll side of the street. We will clarify the drop off locations on the survey form. Your feedback is important, so we hope you will complete and return your survey. Thank you in advance.

Security guards have been monitoring the grounds daily (7 days a week) Monday to Friday 9:00pm to 7:00am, and on Saturdays and Sundays from 7:00pm to 7:00am (statutory holidays, the hours may vary). Reminder to contact the TNO office should you have any security related concerns, and TNO staff will contact the security guard on duty to respond as required.

The Provincial election was held on Thursday February 27th, 2025. Polling stations were available in both Heritage Hall and Horizon Hall for our tenants and residents to vote.

By now you would have received your 2024 income tax receipts for rent, care fee and donations (for those who donated in 2024) and promissory notes (if applicable). We have new financial software for processing tenant rent and care fee receipts. The receipt says "2024 Rent Receipt", however in the detailed breakdown, you will see the words "Room & Board". There is text on the receipt clarifying that this wording is in fact "Rent" and not "room and board". We have included a Q & A page on Rent Receipts. If you still have questions about your rent receipt, please don't hesitate to speak to the Tenant Business Services office.

Cable services – we met in February with Rogers and the start date to implement Rogers Ignite may need to be pushed forward another month. We will provide much more detailed information to everyone as we finalize the details of this implementation. Please note that this upgrade / change will not affect current cable or internet services in Faith Manor. We will be holding town hall meetings with tenants and Rogers so you can ask questions about this new service.

I am pleased to report that the lease for the old Faith Manor (Bethany Place) is now complete. Our Lease holder is Tyndall Nursing Home owned by Sharon Village Care Homes. They were evacuated from their nursing home during a flood in August of 2024. They have a new building currently under construction with an anticipated completion date of January 2027. They need a temporary location until they can move to their new building. They will provide their own staff. The lease includes the exclusive use of the Red Tulip, and use of the Grace Manor laundry and Faith Manor dishwashing areas (after hours). The Lease stipulates that Tyndall's staff will not have access to park on our property. Tyndall has made arrangements for alternative parking for their staff. We cannot control use of our parking lot by their visitors, however they will be subject to the same rules as our visitors. Please note that effective immediately, the Red Tulip and the designated smoking area (outside in front of FM) is no longer available for use by tenants or staff.

Thank you to everyone who donated to our Christmas Appeal for a new shuffleboard room. We are starting to plan for installation. This new shuffleboard room will be located in the same room where physiotherapy is currently operating (ground floor by Shoppers Drug Mart). In order to accommodate the new space, we will be doing a number of office

relocations. Physiotherapy will be moving within the TNO area, more specifically in the area currently housing the Social Worker and Assisted Living Coordinator. These two staff will also be relocated but to two offices within the TNO area (by the Doctors Clinic area). This should take approximately two to three months to have all completed.


As previously reported, the Ministry of Long-Term Care accepted Faith and Grace Manors into a time-limited Long-Term Care Homes Cultural Pilot (the Pilot). Our official designation letters were to take effect on February 5, 2025, however due to the recent election being called, we received notification that the launch of this new program would be delayed. We were informed that no new policies or programs are allowed to be introduced during an election period and therefore the launch of the Cultural Homes Pilot would be deferred until after February 27, 2025. I will update once we learn more.

We have still not heard back from the Landlord and Tenant Board regarding the rent increase (above the approved guideline) for which we applied. We will notify tenants once we hear back.

On February 11, 2025, I attended the Tenant Advisory Committee (TAC) meeting and a summary of the minutes / discussion(s) follows my report.

TENANT ADVISORY COMMITTEE UPDATE (TAC)

The Tenant Advisory Committee meeting was held on Tuesday February 11th, 2024 at 8:30am. Tracy Kamino, CEO attended the meeting. The following is a summary of our discussion(s):

Minutes of the January 14, 2025 meeting

 Omission to minutes - it was noted that the discussion about floors being cleaned on Sundays and on Christmas in front of the church was missing from the minutes.

Business arising from last meeting minutes

- A member explained that he and other tenants are against the idea of removing the decorative ledge from the Providence Tower basement. As a result, the project will be on hold until a decision is made.
- Shovels were requested at entrances, however tenants reported this had not been done yet. Tenants were assured that this would be done by the end of day.
- The coffee machine by the Red Tulip will stay there until all supplies are used. A member asked if the Red Tulip coffee machine could be moved to the snack bar area. Tracy explained that this will not resolve the issues, and that the same issues will come forward. Contact has been made with the vendor to provide alternatives where the machine comes with everything built in. We are currently waiting for their response.
- In follow-up to the last meeting, the member informed administration about the specific 4 parking spots in front of King Tower (which all appear to be undesignated) that could possibly be designated for visitors for short 1-2-hour visits. Tracy confirmed that 1 of the 4 spots belongs to a tenant. The remaining 3 spots can be designated as short-term visitor parking. Tracy confirmed that signage has been ordered and will be installed once received provided the ground/snow coverage allows for the installation.

General Discussion

- It was mentioned that some treatments are being performed in the open waiting area of TNO, while they should be performed privately in a treatment room. Tracy agreed stating that she would speak to the Director of TNO about this immediately. We will also provide a privacy curtain to use for tenants who do not wish to go to a treatment room.
- Security started February 3, 2025 one security guard in uniform will patrol the complex daily during the hours of 9:00pm-7:00am Monday-Friday and 7:00pm-7:00am on the weekends and statutory holidays. Contact the TNO office should

- you have any security concerns, and TNO staff will contact the security guard on duty to respond as required.
- Tracy let the committee know that the 2025 budget has been finalized and approved. This is why we were able to start security. A member asked what other upgrades can they expect in regards to capital upgrades. Tracy explained that the amount requested in the budget and the amount received are two different numbers, so we are still working with the Board through this. Tracy stated that she will report at a future meeting once the list is finalized.
- A member brought up that someone was moving out from their apartment on a Sunday. Tracy explained that we do not allow move-ins or move-outs on Sundays. We will not reserve the elevators on Sundays for move in/out. Tenants are told this when they move in and when they give notice to vacate. Despite this, if somebody decides to move out without reserving the elevator, and against our policy, we are limited to what we can do at that time.
- It is time for the "Annual Tenant Survey". Some discussion was held about how we can improve the participation rate. Tracy stated that the Tenant Services Committee suggested to shorten the survey and limit it to just a few key questions which are more open-ended soliciting more feedback. The committee members thought that would be a good idea. They asked if there could be a drop box at reception and also one on the Kingknoll side of the street. There is a box at the pastoral office that could possibly be used. Tracy stated that we will provide an additional locked box somewhere on the Kingknoll side and let tenants know its location once the survey is ready for submission.
- Tenants are helping themselves to items donated to "Encore". Some tenants are upset as they want their specific donated item to go to Encore not to a tenant's apartment. A member asked if there could be a "Take it or Leave it" shelf, where people can donate items, that tenants can take and leave. There used to be one like this in the past. It was not for large items (concern over infection or bed bugs etc). There used to be small things. More discussion is needed. The TAC can explore this more.
- Tracy reported that administration is currently preparing the 2024 rent receipts for distribution by the February 28th deadline. Tracy stated that we have new financial software that is issuing these receipts, however there is one wording that
- tenants should be aware of. You will notice that the receipt says "2024 Rent Receipt", however where there is the detailed breakdown, you will see the words "Room & Board", however there is text clarifying that this is in fact "Rent" and not "room and board". This wording will not impact your filing of income taxes.
- It was brought up that playing bingo and/or games for which money is collected and where not everyone is guaranteed to win a prize, requires a social gambling

license through the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario. Tracy stated she applied for this license. It was very easy to apply, is valid for one year and at no cost to HCH. This social gambling license covers all of Holland Christian Homes. The license is currently posted in every activity / hall area. What is important is that tenants cannot be charged more than \$2.00 to participate in any such activity as outlined above.

- The lease for renting the old Faith Manor is almost complete. This lease will also include the exclusive use of the Red Tulip, and use of the Grace Manor laundry and Faith Manor dishwashing areas (after hours). More information will be available at the next meeting.
- A decision was made regarding cable packages. Rogers Ignite will be coming to HCH. There will be lots of different packages to choose from. More information will follow. Town Hall meetings will be scheduled with Rogers to answer tenant questions.
- A member asked how the fundraising for the Shuffleboard room is doing. Tracy explained \$17,000 was raised to date, however we have not closed the opportunity and continue to raise money. Tracy stated that we have been working with Physiotherapy to secure an alternative space within HCH for them to operate. The new space should be identified by the next TAC meeting.
- Tenants thought maintenance staff would help move tenant's personal furniture. It was discussed that this is not a responsibility of Maintenance. Families or external companies should be contacted to assist.
- There was a discussion about TAC members investigating concerns/rumours made by one tenant about another. This is not the role of a TAC member. Rumours need to be squashed immediately, as they can create a lot of upset especially for the tenant for whom the rumour is directed. Tracy reminded members to please bring rumours or concerns to Tracy immediately, so it can be properly addressed.
- Tracy stated that polling stations will be held in both Heritage Hall (PT, CT, TT, HT) and Horizon Hall (KT, PeT) for our tenants and residents to vote on election day, Thursday February 27th, 2025 (9am to 9pm).

• A member stated that he and other tenants would not like to see the ledge removed from the basement. It was reported that this is contrary from what was discussed at the last meeting. Until a final decision has been made, the decorative ledge will stay as it is.

King Tower

- A tenant who receives magazines in their mailbox has reported parts of the magazine torn off possibly when placing in the mailbox. Tracy will speak to the mail people about this. It may be possible that the mail is torn before it arrives at HCH (during mail processing). We will record the condition of any damaged mail before it is sent to the tenant mailbox. Please advise if any mail is damaged, so we can investigate.
- Horizon Hall air vents are dirty and need to be cleaned. Lorraine stated that Maintenance has already contacted our external vent cleaning company and is waiting for them to confirm a date. This vent cleaning will also be done in other halls throughout HCH.
- A complaint was made regarding the sidewalk between the "Red Tulip" and King Knoll Rd. It looks like it has not cleared from the snow. Maintenance will be asked to speak to the snow removal company.
- The Red Tulip lights are on all night, and tenants would like to see these lights off when not in use. A member stated the cost of these lights are minimal and that the lights being off could be a security and safety issue. Members felt there are more important issues to focus on. Tracy did state that we will get timers for the Christmas trees next year.
- A concern was brought forward regarding some bottles of condiments being left out on tables in the Red Tulip all night. Tracy informed the members that the restaurant is currently being emptied / cleaned out to prepare for the new lease holder as explained above.
- The Christmas decorations are frozen in the ground, and will be removed as soon as possible.

• A tenant asked, why the stools were removed from the elevators. Tracy explained, as per the Fire Code and Fire Department, stools are not permitted in the elevators.

FAQ's for 2024 Tenant Tax receipts

Why does the receipt look different this year?

We started using a new billing program for 2024 which has the ability to create tax receipts which we utilized.

I need to send a copy to my son/daughter/tax person/etc. so they can do my taxes.

It is the tenant's responsibility to get their receipt to whomever they need to.

I usually get 2 receipts – Rent & Care – but I only received one.

This year we have a new program and both Care and Rent are combined and **detailed** on one paper.

I don't see my rent amount listed.

The Room & Board reflects your Rent amount (this was a program default and cannot be changed).

I have subsidy/equity but the receipt shows a lot more than I paid this year.

For those with Subsidy or Equity their Rent amount is actually NET of the Room & Board and Equity/Subsidy deduction amount.

Why do I have two receipts in my name?

If your spouse passed or moved out (eg: LTC) during the tax year you might receive 2 receipts – the combined amount is your total(s) for the year. If you moved apartments during 2024 (internal move) you may receive two received receipts – one from each apartment – the combined amount is the total(s) for the year.

What should I do if later on in 2025 I receive a letter from the CRA requesting additional information regarding the rent amount I claimed.

Should you receive an audit letter from the CRA later this year you can send them a copy of this receipt to answer their question about your rent, the amount, our facility, etc.

I/my family have additional questions about my receipt and/or the amount(s). Who can they contact?

You can visit the front reception desk who can answer your questions or direct you to the correct person or email our team at finance@hch.ca with the subject line 2024 Tenant Tax Receipt Inquiry and your name, apartment and contact information in the email.





Billiards Room


