

"Nations are in an uproar." Psalm 46:6 ~ Pastor Eric Groot-Nibbelink

This simple line from Psalm 46 works as a fitting description of what nations around the world are facing in the present moment. As of this writing, Ukraine continues to endure vicious Russian attacks while games are played regarding "peace-talks." Recently, India and Pakistan, two nuclear powers, living side by side, traded missile strikes. Illustrations of misery in the Middle East appear hourly. The global economy is faltering, aid for the world's disadvantaged is on the decline, trusted relationships among nations are souring and every day there are new symptoms of looming climate change crises.

Uproar in Psalm 46 is not so much a word that describes noise as it is an image that communicates a devastating upheaval and chaos by which the basics of life itself are threatened. Although we confess that in the beginning God created everything good, the current global uproar sometimes feels like things are being "uncreated." It can seem like what was once solid in the world is unravelling.

Part of me wants to resist being so heavy but the truth is we are all witnessing "uproar," essentially everywhere. No doubt, many of us can identify, recalling past uproars from our own lifetimes, both globally and personally.

Psalm 46 can be admired for its honest naming of reality but more importantly for its vision of looking beyond the uproar to God, the God whom the poet addresses as our "rock and our refuge." It's the same God who implores the whole universe, "Be still and know that I am God." (v.10) It's the same God who ultimately conquers all the powers of darkness, evil, misery and death through the resurrection of his son Jesus Christ.

During the 50-day Easter season, we are invited not to ignore the uproar of our times but to know that beyond our world's present circumstances, God is moving history toward a time in which God will make all things new. (Revelation 21:1-5) We trust this vision to hold true because of the good news of Easter.

As we move from Easter to Pentecost, we can be encouraged by picturing the Risen Lord Jesus Christ standing among his friends and offering them a personal word, repeating it three times. "Peace be yours." (John 20:19,21,26) Whatever we may encounter in our lives and times, let us receive personally that same word of assurance, no matter the uproar.

From the desk of the CEO

Dear Holland Christian Homes Community,

It is hard to believe that we are already in the month of June. Mother Nature has been showering us with unseasonably cold weather and rain. A couple of months ago, I was starting to use the fan in my office, and today I had to turn the baseboard heater back on.



Brampton by-law requires landlords of residential buildings to maintain a minimum indoor temperature of 20 degrees between September 15th and June 1st of the following year. We will monitor the weather and make the switch from heat to air conditioning/cooling when appropriate.

The first day of summer in Ontario coincides with the summer solstice. This year, the summer solstice will occur on June 21st at 10:42pm. On this day, the sun reaches its northernmost point in the sky, resulting in the longest daylight hours of the year. It is a time to celebrate the warmth, longer days and the beauty of the season.

On Wednesday May 21st, I really enjoyed spending time with tenants on the Grand River Cruise excursion. Despite the cold and rainy weather, the delicious meal served on our boat "the Grand River Belle", along with a performance by the Blazing Fiddles was a true delight.

In June, we celebrate Seniors Month. I would like to formally recognize and celebrate the work that many of our HCH seniors have done and are doing in our community. Tenant for tenant events have served as a catalyst to keeping our seniors socially connected and engaged in our community. In addition to this, we receive government grant funding for the social activities supported by our Tenant Activities Coordinator (Hadassah). We get special funding through a program called the "Seniors Active Living Centre Program" which is intended to help seniors stay active, become more involved in their community, and get the services that meet their needs close to home. Please attend the fun and special events we have planned to celebrate Seniors Month!

On Monday May 5th, 2025, we celebrated Dutch Heritage Month and held our traditional Flag Raising Event. This year marked the <u>80th Anniversary</u> of the Liberation of the Netherlands from Nazi occupation following the Second World War. The rain interrupted our event but did not dampen the mood or the festivities. Master of Ceremonies was Keith Ambtman, Vice Chair of the Board of Directors. Guests included Mr. Harman Idema, Consul General of the Kingdom of the Netherlands and his wife Marissa Maldonado. Also joining us was Mrs. Elizabeth Witmer former Kitchener-Waterloo MPP and Deputy Premier of Ontario; Sonia Sidhu, Member of Parliament for Brampton South; and Regional Councillors for Ward 3 & 4, Dennis Keenan, and Martin Medeiros.

On May 13th, 2025, I attended the Tenant Advisory Committee (TAC) meeting and a summary of the discussion(s) follows my report. As per the TAC Terms of Reference, all current TAC members terms will end in June. Over the summer, we will need to do a call for nominations and hold an election if required to recruit 2 TAC members per Tower. The newly elected TAC members would start their new terms in September 2025. Watch your mailboxes for more information.

We are still waiting for Rogers to start installing the new cable boxes on the Kingknoll side of the street (now delayed to start in late June). They are waiting for all of the equipment to arrive on site. Reminder to those tenants who wish to have Rogers contact a family member first (rather than the tenant themselves) when setting up the install appointment must contact Jemmie Ramprashad, Director of TNO (ext. #5248). Once we have more information about the timing of the Rogers installation, we will communicate this.

National Nursing Week was held May 12th to 16th, and the theme was "Celebrating nursing action and impact". Holland Christian Homes hosted various events for staff during this week.

We had a delay in getting the grass cut. This year we went to tender for a new landscaping contract which proved to be a challenge. Companies do not want to take on the liability and complexity of a community such as ours. Fortunately, the landscape company from last year has been retained for another year. The lawn was cut and the planting of flowers is in progress. We anticipate some delays in the annual planting due to the colder weather and rain. As an fyi - the contractor is designated to be at HCH every Thursday to cut the lawn (weather permitting).

Tyndall Nursing Home is nearing completion of the necessary upgrades to Bethany Place and remains on schedule for residents to begin moving in sometime in June.

There is mis-information circulating within the HCH community regarding admission to Tyndall. To clarify, HCH tenants who apply for Long Term Care and list Tyndall as one of their choice homes, do not receive priority placement for moving into Tyndall because they are an HCH tenant. Moving into Tyndall also does not give a tenant priority for moving from Tyndall into Faith or Grace Manor. If you apply to Tyndall and are accepted and move in, then you are now a resident of Tyndall. This means that once their new facility in Mississauga is finished being constructed, you will relocate with all other Tyndall residents to this new building. If your # one chosen home was Faith or Grace Manor, and chose Tyndall as your third choice, and you get placed into Tyndall first, you can still transfer back to Faith or Grace Manor later. You must wait for a bed offer to be made to you for Faith or Grace Manor. The timing of this bed offer would be determined by your choices and in consultation with Ontario Health at Home. Please note that once you are admitted to another LTC home, your application priority for any other choice homes will not be top priority status (i.e. crisis application status is removed). Please feel free to speak to me about this if you need further clarification.

After much discussion with our current snack vendor, they have agreed to install a coffee vending machine on the premises on the Kingknoll side of the street. In addition to the coffee machine, the vendor will relocate one of the snack vending machines to sit beside the coffee machine. The new location for both machines would be along the wall between the Peace Tower mail area and the Grace Manor entry doors (where the plants are currently located). Plumbing and electrical are currently being installed to accommodate these machines.

The new shuffle board room construction is progressing well. We will be adding a few pieces of gym equipment as well as a viewing area to the shuffle board room. We hope to have this open within the next 2 months.

Please be advised that any personal advertisement is to be posted in the Tower laundry rooms only. If you wish to post on the main HCH lobby boards, you must get prior approval from management.



We have still not heard back from the Landlord and Tenant Board regarding the rent increase (above the approved guideline) for which we applied. We will notify tenants once we hear back.

We are busy preparing for our Annual General Meeting which will be taking place on June 14th, 2025 starting at 10:00am in Heritage Hall.

TENANT ADVISORY COMMITTEE UPDATE (TAC)

The Tenant Advisory Committee meeting was held on Tuesday May 13th, 2024 at 8:30am. Tracy Kamino, CEO attended the meeting. The following is a summary of our discussion(s):

Business arising from last meeting

- The cigarette butts were cleaned up. The cleaning of cigarette butts has been added to the daily checklist for maintenance.
- Concrete Blocks behind KT have been moved back into place.
- The Tenant Survey action plan has been drafted by staff. Tracy stated that when unfavorable items are identified through the survey, action plans will be developed and implemented to address and correct the concerns. Further discussion and review of the survey results and action plan will take place at the TAC meeting in June.

General Discussion

- Tracy reported that we have had a delay in getting the grass cut. It has been a difficult process in tendering for a new landscaping contract. Companies do not want to take on the liability and complexity of a community such as ours. However, the landscaping company from last year has been retained and will start this week.
- Tracy reported that Tyndall Nursing Home is nearing completion of the necessary upgrades to Bethany Place and remains on schedule for residents to begin moving in sometime in June.
- Tracy stated that there is wrong information circulating within the community regarding admission to Tyndall. HCH tenants who apply for LTC and list Tyndall as one of their choice homes, do not receive priority placement for moving into Tyndall because they are an HCH tenant. Moving into Tyndall also does not give a tenant priority for moving from Tyndall into Faith or Grace Manor. If you apply to Tyndall and are accepted and move in, then you are now a resident of Tyndall. This means that once their new facility in Mississauga is finished being constructed, you will relocate with all other Tyndall residents to this new building. If your # one chosen home is Faith or

- Grace Manor, but you also chose Tyndall as a third choice, and you get placed into Tyndall first, you can still be transferred back to Faith and/or Grace should a bed offer be made to you in the future. This would be determined by your choices and in consultation with Ontario Health at Home. Please note that once you are admitted to another LTC home, your application priority for any other choice homes will not be top priority status (i.e. crisis application status is removed). Please feel free to speak to Tracy about this if you have any questions or need further clarification.
- Members voiced concern over the fact that tenants, residents, staff, visitors, and contractors are smoking all over the complex outside. Tenants have been smoking in areas even though "no smoking" signs are posted like in the gazebo at the back of Bethany Place. There is currently no designated smoking location. There was discussion about whether we can make HCH a "smoke-free" community and what would be involved? Management will look into this. In the meantime, smokers should be smoking off the property the use of the Municipal sidewalks are considered off HCH property.
- Members thanked Len for enhancing the plant area outside of TNO.
- Tracy mentioned that there is an inquiry about having an outdoor lawn bowling area. This is being looked into.
- Tracy reported that the coffee machine by the Red Tulip has officially been removed, and replaced with a water cooler. Management is in discussions with our current vendor who may be willing to install a coffee vending machine on the premises. In addition to the coffee machine, the vendor has also proposed relocating one of the snack vending machines beside the coffee machine. The suggested location for both machines would be along the wall between the Peace Tower mail area and the Grace Manor entry doors (where the plants are currently located). Members felt that this would be a good location.
- Tracy reported that the shuffle board room is coming along quite well, walls are down and flooring is going in. We will be adding a few pieces of gym equipment as well as a viewing area to the shuffle board room. We hope to have this open within the next 2 months.

- There was a concern brought up about personal notices/ads being posted on HCH communication boards. All personal advertisements are to be posted in the laundry rooms only. If anyone wishes to post on the main lobby boards, they must get prior approval from management.
- An issue was brought up about the speeding and noise along McLaughlin Rd. Members were asking about the possibility of getting speed cameras along this stretch. Tracy suggested that TAC may want to create a petition to send to city council around this issue. Members liked this idea. We will draft a petition statement for approval at the next meeting.
- As per the TAC Terms of Reference, all current TAC members terms will end in June. Over the summer, we will need to do a call for nominations and hold an election if required to recruit 2 TAC members per Tower. The newly elected TAC members would start their new terms in September 2025. It was suggested that a form be developed that candidates sign to confirm their willingness to serve on the TAC, while acknowledging that they understand the Terms of Reference and the responsibilities associated with being a TAC member. The process and forms will all be finalized at the June TAC meeting.

Providence Tower

- The apartments facing McLaughlin Rd. have not had their outside windows washed "ever". Tenants were told this is due to the inability to install anchors which support the window washer. Tracy will follow up with maintenance to determine what can be done about this issue.
- There are a number of dog concerns in Providence Tower. Pet waste is all over the property. A tenant has been observed walking their dog along the back wall and allowing the dog to pee on tenant flowers. It was requested to purchase pet waste disposal containers to encourage tenants to discard their pet waste correctly. There is also a dog that gets very excited when it sees people and pees on the floor. Excessive barking was also noted as a concern. One specific dog begins barking as soon as its owners leave and continues until they return. Tracy asked

that such concerns be brought to the admissions office. As the landlord, we will and have addressed such issues. Tracy also mentioned that all tenants with pets are required to sign additional documents acknowledging our policies regarding pets.

• Parking concerns have been raised again by several members, with inquiries about the possibility of adding additional underground parking spaces behind Trinity and Hope Towers. Tracy is currently in communication with Condor (College Plaza management) regarding the potential for providing HCH spaces in their underground parking facility for our use in their future development. We will keep everyone updated as this conversation progresses.

Trinity Tower

• The only concern was about the lawn care, but this was answered already in the general discussion.

Hope Tower

- Lawn maintenance (long grass) was mentioned.
- It was mentioned that channel 990 could be clearer by using only a small amount of text be more direct and with larger font.

Covenant Tower

• It has been observed that some staff members continue to speak in their own language while on duty and in the presence of tenants/residents. This practice is against the HCH Code of Conduct, which requires staff to communicate in English while working and when around residents to ensure inclusivity and transparency. If this behavior is witnessed, please address it with the staff member's direct manager when possible. If you are unsure who to contact, or prefer to escalate the concern, please follow up with Tracy directly.

Peace Tower

- Linens are still not being returned to Horizon Hall after being laundered. Tracy has discussed this with the Laundry Department Manager previously however, will follow up again.
- It was mentioned that some buildings charge an additional fee for tenants who have pets. During the conversation, the question was raised about how such a fee could be used if implemented here? One suggestion was to allocate the funds towards extra cleaning in

apartments as needed due to pet-related wear and tear. Tracy noted that there may be legal concerns surrounding the implementation of a pet fee. Tracy did reassure members that we are following the current city pet by-laws.

- Tenants really enjoy "The Tie that Binds", but have noticed that it generates a significant amount of paper waste and incurs high printing costs. Tracy mentioned that Administration also shares these concerns. To address this, we're exploring options to reduce the overall size and cost of the newsletter while still providing tenants with the valuable information they appreciate. One idea under consideration is to replace the multiple pages of recurring and new activities with a single Activities Calendar printed on an 11" x 17" sheet. This calendar would accompany the newsletter and help condense the content without sacrificing important updates. The other thought was to start having the Tie that Binds sent electronically. More discussion to follow.
- There was a concern raised around TNO staff not looking professional, a specific concern around them not wearing their name tags. Tracy will follow up.
- A question was raised about whether there is a move-in checklist that is expected to be followed prior to renting an apartment. Tracy confirmed that yes, there is a checklist in place to ensure units are properly prepared for new tenants. A member mentioned a recent move-in where some issues were noted that should have been addressed beforehand. The member will follow up with Tracy to provide the specific unit number, so it can be looked into.

King Tower

- Issue around the fire alarms was brought up again. Tracy has previously addressed this concern and apologized around that specific issue over the Easter long weekend, but it was unavoidable.
- A request has been made to install speed limit signs in the KT/PET underground parking garages. Maintenance will be asked to create and post signage to encourage drivers to reduce their speeds and improve safety in these areas.
- The flooring in the gym is wonderful and everyone who has used the gym is very appreciative.
- Issue with staff beeping their car horns to lock their car doors when coming to work was raised again.

Next Meeting will be held on Tuesday June 10th, 2025 at 8:30am in the Boardroom.





Safety, Security & Respect at HCH

Elevator usage during fire alarms, Grace, Peace, and King

As you know, Grace Manor, Peace and King Tower are connected on the same fire alarm system. Many times, fire alarms and fire drills resolve without any trouble and the alarm system is able to be reset. Sometimes though, problems arise where a contractor may need to come and fix a part of the system in order to reset it. In this case, the elevators may be out of service while the contractor is on route. What is our plan for this?

The janitor, charge nurse, or maintenance staff may use the elevator with a special key to take people up on an urgent basis. Please note that the priority is to take care of the Grace Manor residents. Many of them cannot be left alone in the atrium so the staff may have to prioritize the elevators to get them back home. Depending on the time of day, the elevators may have to prioritized to bring food to the residents from the kitchen.

As for King and Peace Towers, staff can only accommodate requests for elevator service for urgent reasons. For example, paramedics may need to get in the building to help someone. Someone may need to go back to their apartment to get medications that they cannot do without. Someone may need to come down from their apartment to go for a specialist medical appointment. While these situations are frustrating, the staff need to prioritize their tasks in order to resolve the incident safely.
